

# Installing Tiki in a sub-directory

The ideal situation is to install your Tiki instance to serve the root of a domain or sub-domain

- `example.org/tiki-index_raw.php`
- `wiki.example.org/tiki-index_raw.php`

Installing in a sub-directory like this

- `example.org/wiki/tiki-index_raw.php`

# Things to watch out for:

- Review your settings for CalDAV and CardDAV.
